

New Restaurant Has Golfers Happy to Be Tee'd Off

Imagine playing Pebble Beach, St. Andrews, or Bethpage Black while enjoying some of the best burgers and beverages in Myrtle Beach. Now, imagine no more. Tee'd Off Bar & Grill, owned and operated by Rob Lombardo and Josh Durham, recently opened, providing an innovative sports bar with a unique dining experience that offers its patrons the opportunity to play virtual golf on 85 of the finest courses around the world.

While most golf courses on the Grand Strand offer a nineteenth hole, Tee'd Off Bar & Grill is Myrtle Beach's first nineteenth hole, that offers golf via their state-of-the-art golf simulators. It's already being hailed by many as an excellent alternative to keep in playing shape during cold or inclement weather, or just for fun anytime. And it's affordable.

"We're going to charge \$12.99 for a half hour, \$20 for an hour," Lombardo said. "So a foursome could come in and pay five dollars a piece to play."

The custom bar area that overlooks the golf simulators have built-in bag drops where golfers can bring in their own clubs or use a rental set provided by Tee'd Off. So patrons can dine while enjoying the golf, and, to continue the theme, will be served by a predominately female staff dressed in caddy attire.

In addition to the golf simulators, Tee'd Off offers other entertainment like a pool table, darts, the 2014 edition of the ever-popular Golden Tee video game, nearly twenty TVs with the Direct TV sports package, and a shark tank that is sure to captivate the attention of young and old alike.

“We really want to tend to the locals,” said Lombardo, who went on to express his desire to create a fun environment, suitable for everyone. “We’re kid friendly and want to be a family establishment.”

While many will come for the entertainment, the menu is sure to please as well with appetizers like Oyster Rockefeller, Boom Boom Shrimp, and traditional fare like chicken wings and beer battered onion rings. Tee'd Off also has an impressive list of salads, crab legs, and a sandwich line-up that features, among other items, their Double Eagle Burger, a variation on the Juicy Lucy with the cheese in the center of the patty. They also have a children’s menu and for those that are really hungry, they can take them up on their “Hole-in-One Challenge,” a 32-ounce burger.

“It’s an eating challenge with a two pound burger and a pound of fries,” said Lombardo. “If you can finish it all in 45 minutes or less, it’s free and you get a Tee'd Off golf shirt.”

Tee'd Off Bar and Grill is open from Monday-Friday from 2 pm-2 am, on Saturdays and Sundays from 12 pm-2 am during football season, and is located in the Galleria Shopping Center at 9668 North Kings Highway in Myrtle Beach.

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
